Partnership Breakfast



History and Mission: The community partnership breakfast is a community based launched effort with a mission to improve civic engagement by information and mobilization strategies that began in October 2002 with 135 attending. These breakfasts are scheduled once every ninety days with the objective to address various issues that negatively impact, the quality of life in various neighborhoods. In 2010, we added four additional breakfasts on the north side of town, which gives us eight breakfasts annually. After ten years of quarterly breakfasts with a sustained attendance per breakfast during this ten - year period of 542 stakeholders. Focusing on increasing each civic clubs service index by adding four – revenue generating, projects. One of the goals will be to recruit 200 new or renewed civic club memberships for 2012. We are serving about 25 zip codes with about 98,000 households with about 60 civic groups. For 2012, we will focus on quality and productivity from all breakfast attendees and civic clubs.

Purpose: The purpose of these breakfasts, are to improve grassroots leadership; to develop programmatic activities through civic clubs; to advocate for improved services and delivery from all governmental departments and service providers. These breakfasts serve as a resource pool, a repository of civic collective history, social interaction, cultural enrichment, business exchange, political platform, and a springboard of diverse access. These breakfasts are non-partisan and we extend invitations to all of the members of the human family.

Security and Safety: The safety and security of these breakfasts are most important to us and we will have security or ushers on hand to escort out any participant that exhibits unacceptable behavior. These breakfasts are at private venues, and are therefore, private.

Co-Sponsorships: There will be a limited amount of co-sponsorships for each breakfast in 2012, and on a first come first serve basis. All co-sponsorships are due in fifteen days before the breakfast by check, money order, cash or PayPal. For PayPal www.charityproductions.us - use the donate button on the (About Us page). Make checks payable to Charity Productions a tax-exempt organization or the church. All annual co-sponsorships will be, pre-invoiced for each quarter. Co-sponsors not on an annual basis must have checks in fifteen days before the event. Last minute and late co-sponsorships will be subject to premium co-sponsorship rates. Co-sponsorships do not include seeking signatures for candidacies, nor does it include commercials or infomercials.

Candidates and Elected Officials: All candidates or elected officials must be registered and confirmed before the breakfast to attend the breakfast. Pop up candidates or elected officials, may not be admitted to the breakfast. There will be no campaign material or advertisement allowed inside or outside on cars in the parking lot, placed on tables by candidate, elected official or staff. Candidates or elected officials once confirmed are the only one that can pass out campaign push cards during the three social breaks. If campaign material are posted on cars a fine of, \$5.00 per car penalty will be invoiced and sent to the candidate or elected official within five – days, payment is due in five days from the mailing date of the violation citation. Service Providers and Agencies: must apply by completing a service partnership statement.
